Judge Landerkin of the Provincial Court of Alberta, is one of only two Canadian judges to graduate from the University of Nevada, Reno with a Master of Judicial Studies Degree. He was the principal architect of the Judicial Dispute Resolution Executive Course for judges at Royal Roads University, British Columbia.

Judge Landerkin had a distinguished legal career as a member of the Alberta Bar. He is a past president of the Calgary Bar Association, a three term elected Bencher of the Law Society of Alberta, a past Chair of the Alberta Law Foundation, and the founding president of the Canadian Research Institute for Law and the Family; a national family law think tank affiliated with the University of Calgary. Judge Landerkin was appointed Queen's Counsel in 1980.
